If the publications do not meet your needs, please examine the map opposite page 54, and send us a list of the locations for which additional data are needed. We could then advise you if there would be more information in publications of which we only have file copies but could be purchased elsewhere.

Ordinarily the cooperative weather observer makes a once-a-day observation of the temperature and rainfall and rarely makes notes with reference to cloudiness, visibility, and driving conditions on the highways. Perhaps the best source of information on the highways would be the Mississippi Highway Patrol.

Hourly observations of cloudiness, rain, and visibility are available for Greenwood, Jackson, and Meridian via microfilm or microfiche copies. They can be ordered from our National Weather Records Center, Federal Office Building, Asheville, N. C. 28801. There is a nominal charge for this service.
