

Re: Internal Security

In connection with future visits of news media representatives within the Criminal Court Building it is my recommendation that in addition to a search for weapons on the person, special attention might also be given to miniature cameras, miniature wireless mikes and miniature recording apparatus.

Such devices can be as small as 1/2 the size of a package of cigarettes and can be mistaken (in shape) for cigarette cases, lighters, writing pens, types of belt buckles, tie clasps and also concealed in ~~the~~ hats and brief cases.

We will have a field strength meter on hand for possible electronic detection

Re: Perimeter Security

It is recommended that consideration be given to having trunks of private cars, which park in the alley between the Criminal Court Bldg and the County Office Bldg, opened by their owners in the presence of a perimeter guard each time they park to determine if any explosive material or device is contained therein.

the user of the car could, at a glance, determine if any contraband had been secreted into his or her trunk compartment without the guard making a "search".

It occurred to me that vehicles parked at residences at night might be entered by someone bent on sabotage - knowing that such vehicles would be parked behind the jail - employing a time delay device.
