WILLIAMS FAMILY CEMETERY

Visited March 29, 1970. This cemetery was located behind an abandoned, crumbling home on the north side of the Southern Railroad tracks at 7364 Poplar Pike, just west of Germantown, Tennessee. The compilers entered the area prepared to find a cemetery in the same condition as the old home and the other buildings, but behind the house, in a small, completely cleared area surrounded by a low wall of loose flat field stones, were nine gleaming white, NEW, matching tombstones neatly placed in a line:
